Before an application can be considered for admission, the following information *must be submitted*.

- 1. APPLICATION FORM:** Please return both copies *intact* to the Department if you are declaring a major or to the Graduate School if you are requesting nondeclared status. All pertinent information must be given on the form; attachments are not acceptable. Illegible, incomplete, photocopied, or pencil applications are not acceptable and will be returned. **THE APPLICATION MUST BE SIGNED AND DATED.**
- 2. INTERNATIONAL STUDENT APPLICATIONS:** Complete both the application and the separate Financial Statement form. **RETURN BOTH DOCUMENTS TOGETHER.**
- 3. OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS:** Request the registrar of each junior college, university, graduate and professional school you have attended to send an official transcript of your record **DIRECTLY** to the Department if you are declaring a major or to the Graduate School if you are requesting nondeclared status. **UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.** For International students, photocopies are accepted only if they bear an original official school seal from the Registrar's Office of the University you attended. The recording of one or more college's grades upon the transcripts of another college does **NOT** meet the requirement. No transcripts or any other application credentials will be returned or forwarded to other institutions.
- 4. SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER** (does not apply to International students). Your Social Security number is important since it will be used in processing your application, and will become your identification number if you are admitted to the University. Applications cannot be processed without this item. If you do not have a Social Security number, obtain an application form at your local post office or nearest Social Security Administration Office.
- 5. PROPOSED MAJOR:** Please use the major listing on reverse side of page one (1) for completion of line 15. If you are applying as an **NONDECLARED** graduate student, leave line 15 blank.
- 6. TEST SCORES.** A TOEFL is required of all International Students whose native language is not English. The official test score report must be sent directly to the Graduate School (all applicants) by Educational Testing Service and the test date must be within the *24 month* period immediately preceding the proposed term of admission. GRE/GMAT/MAT tests are required by some programs. Please refer to catalog, brochure or major department for requirements.
- In order to be admitted to a degree program, an applicant must meet Graduate School admission requirements and be approved by the department or degree program concerned. Departments may require additional information such as letters of recommendation, GRE scores, etc.

General Information

- Admission to the Graduate School is contingent upon receipt of a bachelor's degree.
- An applicant to SIUC will not be considered for admission to two or more departments concurrently.
- Departmental requirements should be checked carefully before you indicate the degree program for which you wish to be considered. If there are questions, please write directly to the department for clarification.
- Questions regarding particular courses and programs should be sent directly to the department concerned.
- Graduate assistantship and fellowship applications may be secured from the department. Assistantships provide a stipend plus tuition waiver and have a 10 or 20 hour per week teaching, research, or service requirement. Fellowships provide a stipend plus tuition waiver, are awarded for 11 months, and have no duty requirements. Graduate Fellowships are awarded on a University-wide competitive basis. The deadline for receipt of fellowship applications is February 1.
- All credentials should be received by the Department and/or the Graduate School at least **THREE MONTHS** prior to the beginning of the term for which you wish to be considered for admission. (**SIX MONTHS** for International Students).
- For international students, all credentials should be received by the Department and/or the Graduate School at least six months in prior to the beginning of the term for which you wish to be considered for admission.
- The Office of Disabled Student Services provides special facilities and services for students with permanent disabilities. Students interested in such services should directly contact that office.
- If you fail to enroll in courses for the initial term for which you applied, you will be required to update your application by notifying the Graduate School in writing. If your first registration in courses is more than one year after the term for which you first applied, you will be required to complete the entire application process again.
